Almost all occupations use electricity in some manner and ELT training will open many opportunities for the students. The ELT courses I have covered include everything from electronics, to power wiring, to computer controls to motors. None of our students will be specialists when they complete these courses, but they will 'teased' and perhaps motivated to carry on to higher learning.
