ABOUT THE SESSION:

What kinds of things or activities can you bring to the school without (or before) travelling on a fieldtrip? Often, it is better to 'show and teach' some survival concepts before embarking on a outdoor hike, camping, or backpacking trip so that these skills have been practiced before needed.

In this session, Linda will discuss some simple but necessary concepts that are essential to being not only safe in the outdoors, but properly prepared in the event that disaster strikes and one is stranded outdoors with no help coming in the immediate future. From different ways to make shelters (quincies and lean-tos) to knowing how to properly and successfully start a fire, she will discuss how these can all be demonstrated and performed in the school yard. This session will provide enough information to help plan for as many as six hours of activities outside in the school yard.

Linda Wagers has been teaching since 1990. Along with her B.Ed, Linda has her Bus. Admin. and B.Sc and is an avid outdoors person.
