At Peace River High School he has been working together with staff to improve the effectiveness of teaching, assessment and discipline practices with programs like the Collaborative Response Model (Jigsaw Learning and Kurtis Hewson), Assessment Cohort with Alberta Assessment Consortium, HIgh School Redesign and Restorative Practices in Schools.
